Moms and dads woke up, boys and girls woke up. Everyone woke up!













"Yes, but you are poor," said the rich man. "Take the gold so you can be rich."


So Abu Dubdub took the gold. The rich man threw the Ramadan drum in his burn pile.





Early in the morning at sahoor Abu Dubdub did not play his drum so the people did not get up for sahoor.




When the people woke up the sun was in the sky! "Subhan'Allah!" they said, "What happened to the Ramadan Drummer?"

















