Celebrating African and African American Muslim History
A contest for Muslim middle schoolers

Muslim middle schoolers from across the United States are invited to research and submit a Google Slide presentation about an African or African American Muslim that made an important contribution to a historical movement or issue.

Required Content:

1. Title Slide with:
 - a. Name of the person that the presentation is about
 - b. A short “catch phrase,” “tag line” or quote from the person that highlights something important about them
 - c. Picture of person or something that represents the person
2. General facts about the person
 - a. Date of birth/death (if known)
 - b. Place(s) they lived
 - c. Family/Culture/Historical roots
 - d. Time period they lived in
 - e. Something important about that time period
3. Contribution to a Historical Movement or Issue
 - a. Description/info related to how they contributed to a historical movement or issue
4. How Islam inspired them
 - a. Be specific. Tell the audience about Islamic values that motivated them. If possible, include quotes from the Quran or a hadith to show how that value is based in Islam.
5. Why and how they inspire you
 - a. Again, be specific. Don’t just say, “They inspire me to be a good person...” Tell us what specific actions they inspire you to take, and why they inspire you to do that.
6. Why you think others should know about them
 - a. Why should people care about this person and about reading/hearing your presentation?

All submissions due by midnight Friday, February 18, 2022. No late submissions will be accepted. Student name and school should not be included on the Google Slide presentation.
